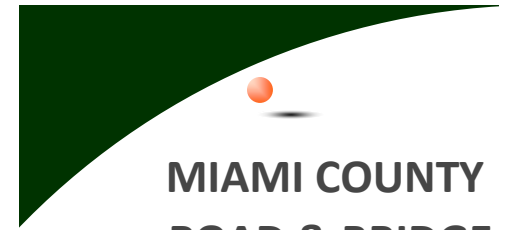

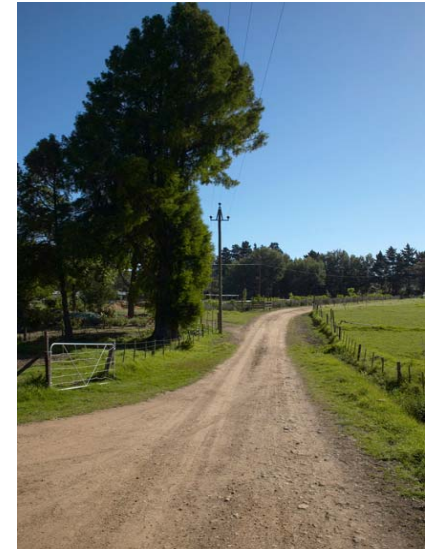

MIAMI COUNTY, KS.

Residential growth in Miami County has greatly increased in the last 13 years with a number of residents choosing to live in the rural areas. Since the county's road system was essentially designed for farm use only and 77% (700) of the miles are gravel, a number of residents now live on these gravel roads.

Because there is a desire for residents on these roads to obtain some manner of dust control to improve their quality of life, Miami County has offered a Dust Abatement Program for the last 20 years and will continue to do so in 2010. Both Oil and Magnesium Chloride (at differing prices) will be offered this year.

Miami County, through the Road and Bridge Department will provide dust abatement for county residents who make application for such measures. The program will start on June 1, 2010 and continue through completion.

While counties in Kansas are not required to control dust on county roads, nor does any Kansas county provide a free dust control program; Miami County understands the seriousness of the problem and the concerns of area residents and offers the service as cost efficiently as possible.

Purpose and Outlook of the Dust Abatement Program

The purpose of the Miami County Dust Abatement Program is not to encourage people to build along gravel roads, but to offset the effect of dust that is associated with a gravel road.

General Details

- The 2010 Miami County Abatement program will offer two options, Oil and Magnesium Chloride.
- Applications of Dust Abatement will begin June 1, 2010. Requests for treatment must be submitted and postmarked by May 21, 2010.

- Treatment applications will be scheduled to comply with best use of county personnel and equipment.
- Dust abatement areas will be graded prior to product application.
- Once the dust abatement material is applied, the road surface will not be bladed until deterioration sets in.

Oil Application

Miami County is offering in 2010 the same process that was done in 2009. Asphalt oil will be applied, followed by a mechanically applied thin layer of limestone rock/chip. The application of the limestone will allow minimal disruption to traffic, as well as eliminate the problem of oil being thrown/sprayed on vehicles. The treated roadway will be somewhat dusty for a short period of time until any excess limestone has dissipated through traffic flow. If the county receives complaints about the dust abatement area and determines it is hazardous to traffic, the road will be bladed.

- Cost is **\$6.00** per foot with a 300 foot minimum (\$1800 minimum charge)

Residents will be billed after their area has been treated.

Magnesium Chloride

This product was also offered in 2009 and is available again in 2010. The road preparation will be the same as before with the application being done shortly after the surface has been watered. Please be advised that this product does not control the dust 100 percent. This dust abatement material is affected by weather and traffic, which realistically limits its effectiveness to the summer months. The County will pre-wet the roadway

prior to blading in an effort to prolong the effects of the product. It is expected that the lower cost will offset the lesser effects of this product.

- Cost of **\$1.80** per foot with a 300 foot minimum (\$540 minimum charge)

Residents will be billed after their area has been treated.

Please note

Miami County cannot guarantee the life expectancy of any given dust abatement treatment area. Variables affecting the effectiveness and duration of treatment includes traffic, thickness of gravel, drainage, etc.
